#### City Park

# WINTERS' HISTORY

Settlement of the Winters area began in 1842 when John Wolfskill occupied a 17,000 acre Mexican land grant along Putah Creek, where he commenced growing vegetables, fruit trees, and grape vines. In the 1850s, additional settlers began to arrive in the area, among whom were D. P. Edwards and Theodore Winters. The future of this edging community was assured when the Vaca Valley Railroad extended its line into the area and a bridge was constructed over Putah Creek.

By 1876 Winters had become a busy agricultural and commercial center with three trains daily. Produce of the area included apricots, peaches, plums, almonds and olives. The predominant production of fresh fruits has been gradually replaced by the nut industry. However, fruits and olives still constitute a major part of the agricultural scene.

In April 1892, a major earthquake struck Winters and damaged many buildings and residences. The town quickly rebuilt and Main Street is today listed on the National Register of Historic Main Streets. The City of Winters was incorporated in 1889.

Today Winters remains a vibrant, picturesque, small city with a strong sense of community. It is located in the heart of a rich diversified agricultural area. It is also in the midst of wonderful recreational activities including Putah Creek, Lake Solano and Lake Berryessa.
